



How to get to Sayers Croft

By Car

For those with GPS the centre postcode is GU6 7SS.

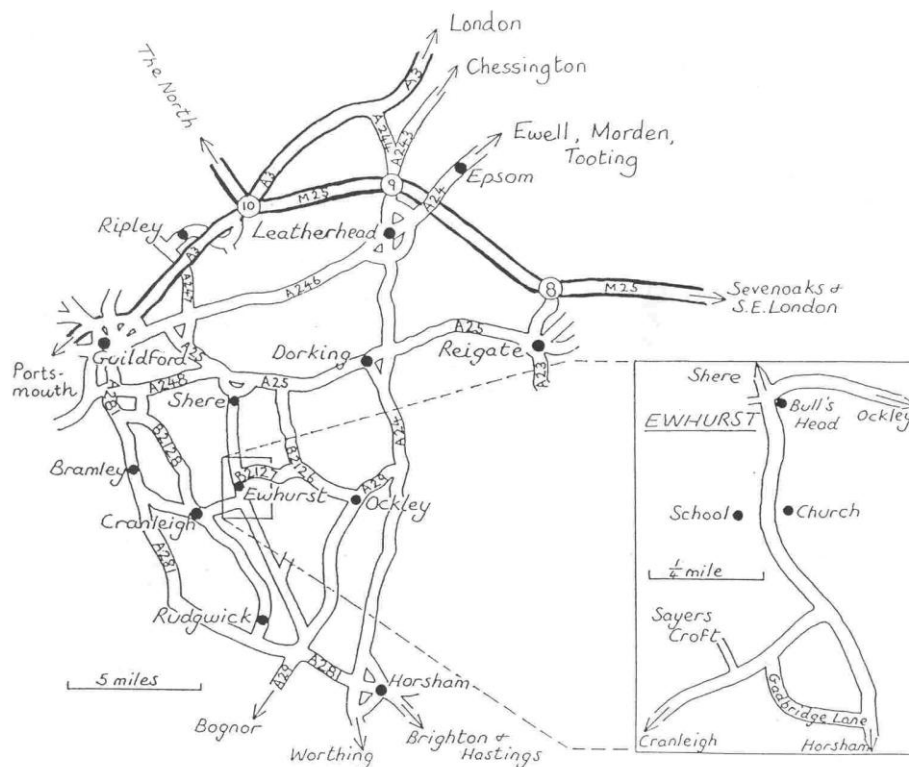
Via the M25 (J9)- Leave the M25 at junction 9 , pick up the A24 towards Dorking. Follow the A24 until a big roundabout, take the 4th exit for A29 (signposted Bognor Regis, Ockley). On entering Ockley take the left hand turn onto the B2126 (signposted Ewhurst). Follow the road to the end, at the Bulls Head pub turn left. Follow the B2127, through the village, round a sharp right hand bend and look for the green Sayers Croft sign on the right.

M25 (J10) Follow signs into Guildford (then follow instructions from Guildford)

From London Use either the A24 (via tooting) or the A3. Follow the A3 to Guildford (then follow instructions from Guildford) or Follow instructions from A24 in the top description.

From Horsham Take the A281, follow the signs for Guildford. At the roundabout take the A29 (London). After 100 yards turn left (signposted Rowhook). Follow the road to Ewhurst. On reaching Ewhurst, go past the green and turn left at the phone box into Gadbridge Lane, then turn left at the T-junction and immediately right into the centre.

From Guildford Follow the A281 towards Horsham. After Bramley turn left and follow the signs for Cranleigh. At the end of the main high street Branch left onto B2127. As you enter Ewhurst the centre is on the Left.



By Public Transport

The best way to reach the centre is to take the train to Guildford and then the bus to Ewhurst.

In Guildford a bus service links the bus and rail stations, departing roughly every 10 mins during the day and is free to train ticket holders. Alternatively allow 15 mins to walk.

When boarding the bus, ask for Sayers Croft, Ewhurst and you will normally be let off at the end of our drive.

Bus No. 53 runs between Guildford Bus Station (stand 1) and Ewhurst. They run hourly during the day (except Sundays). Bus No 25 runs every 2 hours (from stand 21 & 22), taking a more scenic route
